Dr. Rowley is a distinguished professor of Hematology/Oncology and Genetics at the University of Chicago and has pioneered the study of genetic connection to disease, particularly leukemia and lymphoma. Established in 1959, the National Medal of Science acknowledges individuals in the fields of physical, biological, mathematical, engineering, social and behavioral sciences. A committee of 12 scientists and engineers appointed by the President choose the recipients.

**The G & P Foundation** was established in 1996 by songwriter Denise Rich and her son-in-law Philip Aouad, in memory of Denise's daughter Gabrielle Rich Aouad, who died at age 27 from AML Leukemia.
